As Police and Crime Commissioner I am responsible for setting the budget for your policing services, this includes setting the precept, which is the element of your council tax that goes to the police.

I have taken 85% of gross into account a expenditure is spent number of different on Police Officers factors, such as the and Staff Pay and Chief Constable's resourcing requirement, the level of reserves, funding from Central Government, feedback from residents and business owners of the Dyfed-Powys area, along with investment requirements for critical infrastructure.

Given the array of pressures and service demands faced, I have carefully considered the significant impacts and risks that threaten our local communities. This level of funding will enable the Force to continue to focus on the delivery of my Police and Crime Plan and continue to safeguard the public of Dyfed Powys.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, 2020/21 has been an unprecedented year, with many challenges. I am mindful that the impact on both society and the economy will undoubtedly

> a long legacy which could significantly affect the future provision of public services, including policing and our criminal justice system.

For the 2021/2022 financial year, I have taken the decision to raise the precept by 5.76% which is consistent with the UK Government's precept flexibility, announced in December 2020. This means an additional £1.25 per month for a Band D Property (£275.56), which will remain the lowest police precept level in Wales.
