## **1. Apologies, introductions and overview**

The PCC welcomed all to the Roundtable Discussion, introductions were made, and apologies represented.

The purpose of the Select Committee review was reiterated, and the PCC reflected on the effectiveness of this approach to scrutiny activity. It was agreed that the term 'Select Committee' had impacted partner involvement.

The PCC advised attendees that moving forward, scrutiny undertaken by the OPCC will align with the PCC's authority to convene partners to collaborate on crime prevention and community safety initiatives<sup>1</sup>, taking a form similar to that of today's meeting; a multi-agency Roundtable process.

## **2. Dyfed-Powys Police's Prevention, Intervention and Engagement Project**

Superintendent Chris Neve provided attendees with an update on the work of the Prevention, Intervention and Engagement (PIE) Project.

**Action 20: OPCC to co-ordinate an update on the PIE Project for the Police and Crime Panel.**

**Action 21: OPCC to co-ordinate PCC/DPP attendance at Public Service Board and Community Safety Partnership meetings around September/October 2026 to provide an update on both the Select Committee review, and the PIE Project.**

## **3. Report findings and recommendations**

The PCC presented each of the review's recommendation in turn, providing details of the findings and evidence leading to the drafting of the recommendation.

Attendees discussed each recommendation, proposing some changes to wording, as well as additional recommendations/areas of focus.

**Action 22: Working Group to update report and recommendations as agreed at the Roundtable Discussion.**

A Select Committee member reflected on the use of the term 'young people' to represent 18–25-year-olds. It was suggested that, to the public, this would mean those aged under 18, perhaps 10-18-year-olds. It was agreed that as the cohort who are the subject of this review are adults, the term 'young adults' should be utilised instead of 'young people' within the published report and accompanying documents.

**Action 23: Working Group to edit the Select Committee report and accompanying appendices document reflecting the decision to utilise the term 'young adults' instead of 'young people' to represent the 18-25 cohort.**

**4. Next steps**

The report and recommendations will be finalised, published on the PCC's website, and shared directly with all relevant stakeholders including the Police and Crime Panel.

The PCC and the DPP PIE Project team will provide updates to partners on both pieces of work.

The PCC will then request updates from those subject to the review's recommendations six months after the report's publication.
